Mitchell Contractors Successfully Completes Four Freedoms House Renovation

Major \$7-million HUD project arrives on time and on budget

(VASHON, WA) November 20, 2014 --Mitchell Contractors Inc., a 32-year old general contracting firm, has completed a massive, yearlong rehabilitation project at the Four Freedoms House of Seattle and the Henry M. Jackson Apartments operated by Prudent Properties of Miami, FL.

Built in 1963, the Four Freedoms House complex has been home to low-income seniors for more than 50 years. The newer Henry M. Jackson building, constructed in 1982, completes the senior housing facility of 372 total units, situated on a 6-acre site on scenic Bitter Lake. This property, even though well maintained, is typical of older, senior developments and was overdue for structural and cosmetic upgrades.

Included in the extensive renovation were seismic retrofits, kitchen and bathroom upgrades, a complete renovation of public spaces and offices as well as refurbishing the parking garage, parking lots, roofs and building façade. An additional feature is a new public transportation stop designed for the elderly residents.

This Four Freedoms project was more than five years in the making and required construction work be completed while the facility was occupied. Funding and approval was obtained through a Federal Housing and Urban Development (HUD)-backed loan that required continuous governmental oversight during the approval and reconstruction process with monthly inspections plus a rigid completion timeline.

"Throughout the Four Freedoms project, there was a continuous schedule of approvals and changing conditions. This required setting standards that are unique to the construction industry. Tenants needed to be informed, safe and comfortable while the intense construction schedule stayed on track," said Merrill Jannison, VP for sales & marketing.
